- Responses to inquiries on the APPEAL INFORMATION STATEMENT shall be typed, unless the form indicates otherwise.
- 5. In all appeals filed with the Court of Appeals, the appealing party or parties shall file the completed APPEAL INFORMATION STATEMENT with the Clerk of the North Carolina Court of Appeals, P. O. - II. In the alternative, is the decision of the Superior Court ambiguous and unclear as to whether it declares facially invalid N.C. Gen. Stat. §§ 115C-2, 115C-106.3(19), 115C-150.13 and 115C-218.1(c), such that remand is appropriate to require clarification by the Superior Court?
